

Kateryna Smaglyi has almost 20 years of professional experience ranging from international organizations, diplomatic missions, democracy promotion foundations, civil society and academia.

In 2015-2018 Kateryna served as Director of the Kennan Institute Kyiv Office. In this capacity she organized leadership and democracy schools for the students of displaced universities of Donbas and in partnership with the Foreign Ministry of Ukraine promoted the institutional development of Ukraine's public and cultural diplomacy.

Prior to joining the Kennan Institute, she served as a Kyiv-based consultant of the Brussels-based European Endowment for Democracy (EED), where she assisted the EU foundation with developing a Ukraine-focused strategy and engaging with new civic actors striving for democracy at the EuroMaidan.

In 2009-2012 Kateryna led the Anti-Crisis Humanitarian Program at the International Renaissance Foundation, where she designed and implemented a variety of large-scale philanthropic initiatives in support of Ukraine's educational and cultural institutions. In 2003-2008, Kateryna worked for the U.S. Embassy in Kyiv as the principal liaison officer with the Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine. In 2005 she was awarded a Superior Honor Award by the U.S. Department of State "For sustained superior performance to promote democracy in Ukraine during the 2004 'Orange revolution'."

Kateryna Smaglyi holds a Ph.D. degree from the History Department of the Central European University (Budapest), LL.M (Master of Laws) in European Union Law from the University of Reading (UK) and BA in humanities from the National University of the Kyiv-Mohyla Academy.

As a 2012-2013 Fulbright-Kennan scholar, Kateryna studied the history of American philanthropy and social entrepreneurship. Based on her research, she published the book *"Everyone is a Changemaker: Social Entrepreneurship and Strategic Philanthropy."* She serves as a board member of the Ukrainian Fulbright Alumni Association "Ukrainian Fulbright Circle" since 2014.
